The average monthly income for a family of three accessing food pantries in the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank network was \$806 or \$9,672 yearly. 94% have monthly incomes below the Federal Poverty Level; an income below \$1,375.

Only 60% of the population served by the foodbank's partner agencies receive Food Stamps, although all appear to be categorically eligible. Their monthly Food Stamp allotment average was \$198.03 or \$6.60 daily.

- 39% were children under 18 years old
- 48% were adults between 18 and 59
- 13% were seniors age 60 and older
- 33% include at least one adult working in some capacity
- 11% indicated this was their first time at the pantry while 15% access services provided at least ten to 12 times a year
- 15% reported they attended college or a two-year technical school to further their education
