



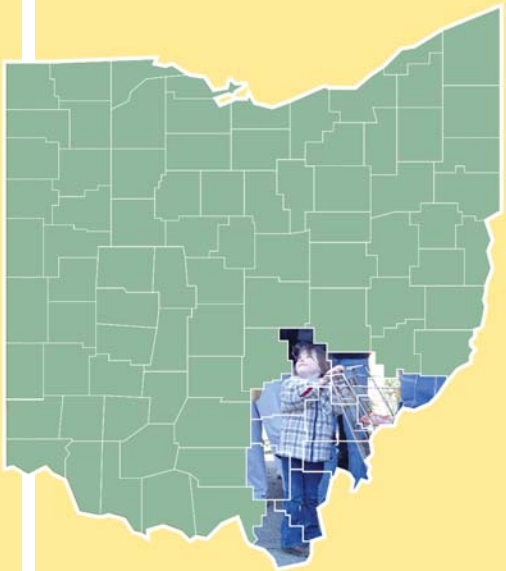

### From "Hunger in Ohio 2007"

The average monthly income for a family of three accessing food pantries in the Second Harvest Foodbank of Southeastern Ohio network was \$903 or \$10,836 yearly. 96% have monthly incomes below the Federal Poverty Level; an income below \$1,375.

Only 64% of the population served by the foodbank's partner agencies receive Food Stamps, although all appear to be categorically eligible. Their monthly Food Stamp allotment average \$163.65 or \$5.46 daily.

- 28% were children under 18 years old
- 43% were adults between 18 and 59
- 29% were seniors age 60 and older
- 28% include at least one adult working in some capacity
- 7% indicated this was their first time at the pantry while 27% access services provided at least ten to 12 times a year
- 12% reported they attended college or a two-year technical school to further their education
