The average monthly income for a family of three accessing food pantries in The Foodbank, Inc. network was \$641 or \$7,692 yearly. 97% have monthly incomes below the Federal Poverty Level; an income below \$1,375.

Only 59% of the population served by the foodbank's partner agencies receive Food Stamps, although all appear to be categorically eligible. Their monthly Food Stamp allotment average \$163.81 or \$5.46 daily.

- 39% were children under 18 years old
- 42% were adults between 18 and 59
- 18% were seniors age 60 and older
- 20% include at least one adult working in some capacity
- 13% indicated this was their first time at the pantry while 5% access services provided at least ten to 12 times a year
- 20% reported they attended college or a two-year technical school to further their education
