

The average monthly income of families accessing food pantries was \$868. Households reporting they receive public benefits 69% receive Food Stamps averaging \$197 monthly or \$6.58 daily.

- 39% were children under 18 years old
- 48% were adults between 18 and 59
- 13% were seniors age 60 and older
- 37% include at least one adult working in some capacity
- 56% rely on a food pantry's assistance up to six times a year
- 11% reported they attended college or a two-year technical school to further their education

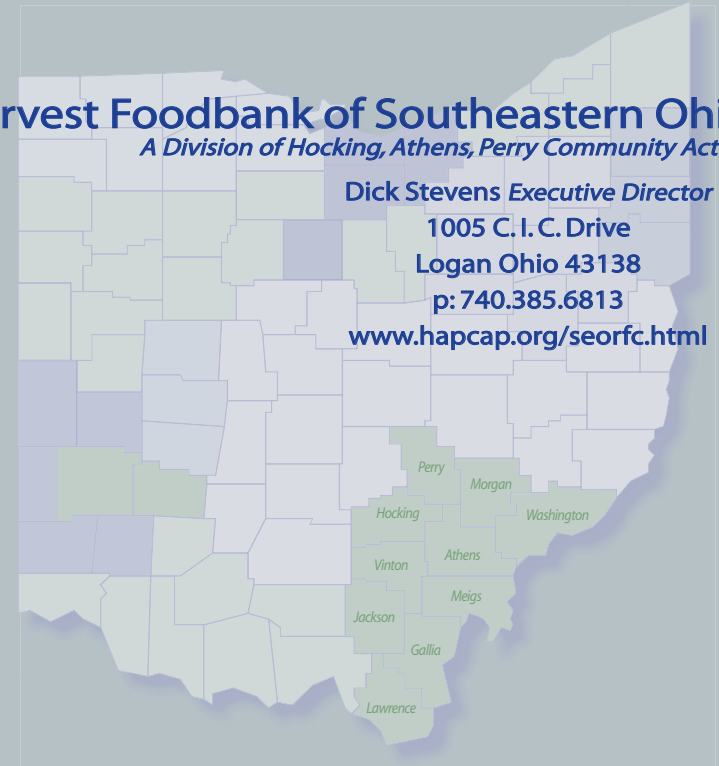
