Congressional leadership during the last farm bill helped to strengthen the Food Stamp Program, The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Commodity Supplemental Feeding Program. And, the recent enactment of the strongly bipartisan reauthorization of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs, the Summer Food Service Program, the Child and Adult Care Feeding Program, and WIC exemplifies the tremendous support of these important programs for the nation's children.

We urge your continued support of the nutrition assistance programs throughout the 109th Congress. Since their inception, these programs have been modified to make them more efficient, and recent legislative changes have increased their effectiveness in reaching those in need. We oppose any reduction in funding or change in the basic structure of these programs that would deny benefits to people who are most in need including children, elderly and disabled people, and the working poor, the primary beneficiaries of the nutrition programs. As organizations who work with and represent these vulnerable populations, we are very concerned that they will become victims of budget cuts by this Congress.

The powerful partnership between our faith-based network of service providers and advocates and the federal nutrition assistance programs is exemplary, and we know you share our commitment to keeping it strong.
